


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The previous page features projects that SICOG has assisted in securing funding through grant application assistance or SICOG affiliated programs. The projects are listed starting with the top left picture and moving counter clockwise.

**Ringgold County** - Mount Ayr Community Garden located in Mount Ayr, Iowa. SICOG provided funds through a Healthy Choices! 5-2-1-0 grant received through the Iowa Department of Public Health. Providing approximately 90% of funding, the remaining funding came from donations.

**Taylor County** - Bunn Building located in Lenox, Iowa. SICOG Housing Trust Fund provided approximately 25% of the funds for renovations to convert to Upper Story rental housing for 80% LMI Residents. SICOG also prepared a \$100,000 Community Catalyst grant for this project.

**Adams County** - Corning Hotel located in Corning, Iowa. The Southern Iowa Development Group (An affiliate of SICOG) provided a working capital loan to mitigate the effects of reduced occupancy during the Covid-19 pandemic. (Providing approximately 18% of the total project)

**Adair County** - Adair Viaduct located in Adair, Iowa. Funding Sources - Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs, Iowa DOT City Bridge Program & ATURA Surface Transportation Program.

**Union County** - Afton Splash Pad located in Afton, Iowa. Funding sources - Dekko Foundation, private & foundation grants.

Clarke County - East Lake Park Campground located in Osceola, Iowa. Funding sources - Iowa Department of Natural Resources, private & foundation grants assisted in creating a 25-site RV campground with water & electricity hookups, a dumping station & shower house.


**Decatur County** - Lamoni Recreational Trail located in Lamoni, Iowa. Funding Sources - Iowa Department of Natural Resources, private & foundation grants.

**Madison County** - John Wayne Birthplace Museum located in Winterset, Iowa. Funding Sources - Iowa Economic Development Authority, Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs, private & foundation grants.





SICOG staff wrote approximately \$13.85 million in grant applications for cities, counties, and other organizations and received notice that as of December 31, 2022, \$5.2 million of those grants were funded for projects within the region. In grant dollars alone that is a \$69.67 return for every membership \$1 invested by cities and counties.

The pages that follow offer a summary of the work completed by our staff. The SICOG Executive Board has provided policy direction and guided the organization over the past year. This 13-member board has an elected official from each of the 8 counties, 4 representatives from regional businesses, plus a representative from Southwestern Community College. We are confident in the continued stewardship of the human and financial resources administered. If you have not taken advantage of all the services that SICOG can provide for your county or community, we encourage you to reach out to any staff member and discuss your projects and goals. SICOG is a great resource for the region, and they have the ability to serve and help us achieve because we, as a region, are all working together. When each of us as board members sit down at the table, we come together as partners building a stronger region together.

As this year of Chairmanship ends, I am proud of the work being done and the results being achieved throughout the region.

Regional Planner





## Regional Priorities

SICOG prepared a regional priorities questionnaire. The surveys were sent to city, county, and associate members. An additional survey was sent to economic development groups, SICOG board members, and partners. The total regional responses are shown here.



Housing & Economic Development finished first and second, and Transportation & Sewer tied for third. They were followed by Comprehensive Planning, Local Planning, and Elderly. This ranking is not unexpected as the top 3 priorities have been in the same position for five years. These issues, especially housing, are where much of SICOG's efforts were focused in 2022.

# Southern Iowa Council of Governments CEDS 2022

The document includes a background summary, SWOT analysis, action plan, and evaluation framework to be used in future planning. The goal of this document is to guide the overall economic resilience of the region.

## Comprehensive Planning and Zoning

SICOG assisted Lamoni with a comprehensive plan update in 2022. SICOG also provided GIS zoning maps for Lamoni and Greenfield. Comprehensive plans develop goals, vision statements, and policy ideas to guide the growth and development over the next 20 years. SICOG continues to focus on local planning and management in order to help our members function more efficiently and make sustainable development decisions.

## Hazard Mitigation Planning (HMP)

In 2022, SICOG worked on multi-jurisdictional hazard mitigation plans for Adams, Clarke, and Adair Counties. Each HMP provides a pro-active framework for each jurisdiction to reduce the severity of hazards that impact its community. Hazard Mitigation plans help local jurisdictions identify which hazards pose the greatest threat to a community, determine which projects to undertake, and provide possible funding avenues.

## Hazard Mit. Planning Process

## Façade Projects

In 2022, SICOG worked with Greenfield, Creston, Dexter, and Osceola on downtown façade projects. SICOG submitted applications for Greenfield and Dexter in 2022. Creston's project included eleven buildings and is now complete. Osceola's project involves eight buildings and is currently ongoing. Façade programs help assist building owners to improve and maintain existing commercial and residential buildings within a community's downtown.



## Examples of Successful Projects in 2022

## **Housing Projects**

2022 was a very interesting year for housing. Early in the year, IEDA announced they would be ending the single-family owner-occupied housing rehab program. In 2022, SICOG continued or finished administering CDBG rehab grants for Creston, Dexter, Greenfield, Afton, Osceola. During the year, SICOG helped several towns apply for one-time COVID funds called the Downtown Housing Grant. Two successful projects were 108-112 N. Maple in Creston and 721 Davis Avenue in Corning. The work on these buildings will occur in 2023. A total of 14 new apartments will be generated. SICOG also assisted in an application that was funded in early 2023 for 209 W. Montgomery Street. This project is from the CDBG Upper Story Conversion fund. The three total projects will invest over \$3 million in housing, using \$1.3 million in federal funds along with city and private funds.

## Infrastructure Improvements

SICOG continued to administer previously funded CDBG awards for water and sewer projects in the region. A water treatment plant project in Creston and a wastewater treatment plant project in Osceola were nearly completed by the year's end. SICOG also submitted and received funding for a downtown water main replacement project in Creston.

## Examples of Successful Projects in 2022

## Park & Recreational Projects

**Bridgewater City Park-** SICOG assisted the city with several funded applications in 2022 to modernize the city park. Improvements focus on new playground equipment and surfacing to make it safer and more user-friendly. Handicap accessibility is a feature of the project.

Winterset All-Inclusive Playground- SICOG assisted the city with funded applications in 2022 for the creation of an all-inclusive playground, which included a \$100,000 Wellmark Foundation grant. This \$1 Million project will compliment City Park and those attractions within the park, the City of Winterset and Madison County. The park project will create a playground that allows play and activities for all abilities. This all-inclusive playground will include a merry-go-round, zipline, ramps, safety surfacing, adaptive switch technology, swings, proper drainage, safe curbing and sidewalks.

**Afton & Lenox Trail Extensions-** The cities of Afton and Lenox with the assistance of SICOG, were awarded funds for extending city trails. Afton will connect the city to the school and add sidewalks to residential areas where safe off-street walkways currently do not exist. In Lenox, trails will be extended to connect the school district and the new athletic courts, with safe crossings and signage.




**Warning Sirens-** SICOG assisted with the updating of warning sirens for the cities of Bridgewater and East Peru.

Grant Activity for the Application Year 2022



SICOG and its affiliates offer financing to businesses and cities in the Southern Iowa region through the programs outlined below.

Industrial/Business Revolving Loan Funds

- Since 1987, \$7.4 million has been loaned to job creators throughout the region.
- Eligible applicants: New or existing industries & businesses which provide permanent jobs and meet established RLF criteria.
- This RLF has made 101 loans.
- At year end, the funds have \$1.4 million available to assist with job creation and retention.
- Available to SICOG member communities with a population under 3,500.
- Financing for unforeseen, emergency related community improvements.
- Includes, but not limited to, fixing broken public water or wastewater lines, repairing a fire truck, replacing damaged or defective equipment, or replacing the roof on city hall due to leaks.
- Loan limit is \$20,000.
- At year end, \$42,735 is available for new loans.

Community Investment Revolving Loan Fund

First Time Homebuyers Revolving Loan Fund

- The Housing Revolving Loan Fund was created for down payment assistance only.
- New loans are up to \$6,500, which must be matched dollar for dollar with funds from the borrower.
- 25% local match required and can be provided by a local bank, development group, realtor, city, county or private individual.
- Loan length is seven years, the first two years are deferred of interest and payments.
- \$100 application fee, and 1% closing cost.
